

Call for submissions to the *Yearbook of Phraseology*

The *Yearbook of Phraseology*, sponsored by the European Society of Phraseology (EUROPHRAS) and published by Mouton de Gruyter, seeks submissions from scholars interested in contributing to the advancement of knowledge in the field of phraseology. It is hoped that the *Yearbook of Phraseology* will make a significant contribution to published research in phraseology, facilitate dialogue between Continental and English-speaking scholars and build a comprehensive understanding of the many facets of phraseology.

The *Yearbook* is an international publication. Contributions are subject to peer review. Contributions will be accepted in English, French, German, Spanish. 60% of each issue will be in English with extended abstracts in English for non-English papers. The *Yearbook* publishes book reviews in English. (For further information about the *Yearbook* see www.europhras.org).

Submissions should conform to the *Yearbook's* style sheet downloadable at http://www.degruyter.com/files/down/mouton_journal_stylesheet.pdf. Please send **three** hard copies of the paper to the managing editor and keep an identical copy for reference. Manuscripts will not be returned, so authors will need to refer to their own copy for the incorporation of any editorial changes which might be recommended.

It will be assumed that all submissions contain original work which has not been previously published and is not being considered for publication elsewhere. Related articles being published or considered elsewhere should be acknowledged. **Authors must obtain permission for any copyrighted material.**

Print the manuscript on one side only of A4 paper leaving margins of at least 50 mm on all sides. All parts of the text, including introductory abstract, displayed quotations, notes and bibliography must be double-spaced. Notes should be listed at the end of the main text and immediately before the References. Tables and figures should be printed on separate sheets and placed at the very end of the manuscript. **There should be no line spaces between paragraphs.** Each new paragraph should be indented except for the first paragraph under a heading. Do not justify the right margin or hyphenate within words.

Manuscripts should generally be no longer than 8000 words. To enable anonymous refereeing to take place, the front page of the manuscript should carry only the title of the paper, name/s and affiliation/s of author/s, the word count for the main text of the paper, and full contact addresses for correspondence - postal, email, fax and telephone. Also please do not cite your own work in a way that could identify you. Correspondence will be sent to the first-named author unless otherwise required.

The main text of the article begins on the second page. Head this page with the short title of the article.

A one-paragraph **English** abstract (upper limit 150 words) must accompany the initial submission. This should be written in an impersonal style, using constructions such as 'it has been demonstrated', 'it has yet to be shown'. **In addition, authors should include 3-5 keywords.**
